

The Project

In 1991, The Museum of Flight took retired Boeing B-52G Stratofortress #92584 on loan from the U.S. Air Force; it sat silently for more than 25 years at Paine Field in Everett. When Air Force Crew E-12, who had flown #92584, discovered its presence in 2012, they gathered for a deeply emotional reunion that inspired *Project Welcome Home*. As the project took shape, a committee of Vietnam veterans became inspired to help guide our efforts and properly welcome home a generation of their fellow service members.

The Park

B-52G #92584 spent its entire life in service with Strategic Air Command and was one of 110 G-model B-52s that saw combat duty during the Vietnam War as part of Operations Bullet Shot and Linebacker II. The bronze aviator statue represents veterans from all branches who returned from their service in Vietnam from 1955-1975, and the folded American flag represents those who did not make it home. The Tribute Wall displays names of individuals, squadrons, and others who served their country in Southeast Asia or supported their loved ones from home.

The Purpose

During the war the United States lost nearly 10,000 aircraft and many crew members. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park provides visitors with an understanding of the role aviation played in the war and the scope of loss in human life and aircraft. It provides a setting for veterans to connect, as well as a place to promote healing, generate discussion and stimulate learning.
